FUND COMMENTARY

The US stock market had good reason for a positive performance in December. US employment data remained reasonably healthy. The US Federal Reserve cut its target rate by 0.25% thereby supporting the economy. The surprisingly low US headline inflation figure of +2.7% was good news for capital markets, especially because the cost of shelter, the largest contributor, dropped further. All the other large contributors also moved lower. Earnings revisions for the S&P 500 index continued rising. The announcement of the strong third quarter US GDP of +4.3% further bolstered investor confidence. These collectively led to the traditional 'Santa Claus' rally.

The largest contributors to the Fund's performance over the month were S&P Global, Visa and GE Aerospace. The first two stocks benefited from a general rerating of quality stocks that have operationally continued delivering well, but with their stocks lagging the market for most of 2025 following the sharp rotation away from Quality into AI related stocks. This was also the case for the fourth and fifth largest contributors to performance (Mastercard and Aj Gallagher). It seems the rerating of Quality has begun, with good potential for a material contribution in 2026.

Following a brief lull in November, GE Aerospace's stock recovered its strong momentum in December. High demand for their turbines and aftermarket services led to expectations of high capital returns to shareholders.

The largest detractors from performance were EssilorLuxottica, Netflix and Broadcom. Information that Alphabet (Google) is planning to launch smart glasses with AI capability affected investor sentiment on the first. The unexpected news that Netflix is making a bid for Warner Bros Discovery, along with further news that Paramount Skydance is making a rival bid, affected investor confidence. Despite Broadcom's strong earnings report and news of a further large order from Anthropic, the stock fell on heightened fears over lower expected gross margins on the expanding AI related revenues.



INVESTOR PROFILE

The Fund is appropriate for all investor types, including those with only a basic knowledge of funds, it is compatible with investors who do not need a capital guarantee (investors must be prepared to accept fluctuations in the value of capital, including the ability to bear 100% capital loss) and looking for capital growth.
